ANN SUDMALIS **Liberal**

A South Coast resident for 25 years, Sudmalis lives in Gerringong and served on Kiama Council 1995-99. She worked for ten years as a school science teacher before working with a small family business, Gran's Fudge, originally a Kiama retail store that grew into a supplier of fudge for specialist gift supply and built up a significant on-line business, though the business subsequently broke up through family differences. She was also active in various local community and business groups and worked for retiring MP Joanna Gash for five years. She contested Kiama at the 2007 state election and won Gilmore on Gash's retirement in 2013.



FIONA PHILLIPS **Australian Labor Party**

Phillips was born at Nowra and grew up on a dairy farm at Terara. She completed a Bachelor of Economics degree at The University of Newcastle in 1991, majoring in Industrial Relations and Labour Economics, before pursuing a career in Banking and Industrial Relations as a Senior Industrial Relations Officer for a major bank in Sydney. She also studied Finance and Investment through the Securities Institute of Australia. Phillips later became a full time Business Operations Manager for Defence based at HMAS Albatross. She has since completed a Master of Business degree with distinction from the University of NSW in 2011 and now teaches and tutors at TAFE's Illawarra Institute of Technology and tutors at the University of Wollongong.
